Dear Friends and Neighbors,

I would like to take this opportunity to highlight some of the many programs made possible by a membership in the Friends of the Avon Library and from our Book Sales. As a Board, we have been proud to underwrite a variety of projects to keep you interested in and supportive of the magnificent job being done by our Librarians and Staff. Here are the 2022/23 highlights:

Adult Programs

Over \$4,000 was dedicated to both on-line and in-person lectures, covering topics from classical art to films to history to yoga.

Teen Programs

We help keep teens aware of all that the Library has to offer. In addition to supporting the Teen Advisory Board, one of our biggest promotions was an amazing night of Laser Tag.

Children's Programs

It's never too early to engender a love of libraries. We invested over \$12,000 in reading programs, music, a Ballerina Holiday, a miniature kitchen, and our annual Ice Cream Social.

Sunday Afternoon Music Programs

Hundreds of you appreciated the \$4,400 spent for the return of our winter concerts. They ranged from Pop to Folk to Classical to Hot Jazz, and each played to a full house in the Community Room.

Summer Intern

We invested \$5,775 to help develop interest in a career as a librarian, and to support our staff during its busiest season.

Conference Table and two Benches

During the 2021 replacement of the geothermal heating, ventilation and air conditioning systems at the Library, several trees had to be cut down on library grounds. The wood from two maple trees was milled, dried, and used to create this furniture, preserving the history of the trees in an environmentally supportive manner. As Leona Mae Page, our Library Secretary, enthused: "Thank you for bringing new life to old trees! It's wonderful having such engaged and supportive Friends."
